Reflections of Life

Lincoln Bryant Lee, 85, passed away April 9, 2014 at Howard University Hospital in Washington, D.C. He was preceded in death by his loving wife, Mary Paige Lee, on April 5, 1999.

Born on June 18, 1928 in Moncure, North Carolina to Edward and Evelyn Lee, Lincoln lived a life built upon adventure, scholarship, and family.

After attending North Carolina A&T State University in Greensboro, North Carolina, Lincoln dutifully served in the US Army during the Korean War. He later relocated to Washington, D.C., where he worked as a Nurses' Assistant in Howard University Hospital's Intensive Care Unit for 28 years.

Outside of work, Lincoln was an avid member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Our Redeemer where he served as an usher and member of the Daniel E. Wiseman Brotherhood. He later became a member of St. Paul's Episcopal Church.

Lincoln was also well known for having chef-like culinary skills, a practiced green thumb, and being a consummate family man. He often took pleasure in traveling the world. From Alaska to Europe, Lincoln could regale anyone with stories from his past and present adventures – always the entertainer.

He will be remembered most by his six children: Bonita Bryant, Sharon Kittrell (Alan), Janice Blassingame, Daryle Lee (Veronica), Cheryl Morse and Micah Lee. Lincoln is also survived by 12 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren.

Lincoln is survived by his brother Tyrone and sister-in-laws Ruth Lee and Lena Lee. He is preceded in death by 10 siblings Nina, Julian, Marie, Thomas, Bernice, Grace, Everett, Franklin, Chloe, and DeAlbert.

He was an unforgettable mentor and companion to a host of cherished relatives and friends, whom most would agree was a great man.

Into paradise may the angels lead you. At your coming may the martyrs receive you, and bring you into the holy city Jerusalem.


God saw Granddad was getting tired
